The king of Assyria sent an army and a messenger to Jerusalem. He told the people they should not trust in their king or the God of Israel. Instead they should follow the king of Assyria and they will have peace. The king of Jerusalem was very worried but the prophet, Isaiah, came to him. Isaiah tells him to not be afraid. He tells him that God will lead the king of Assyria to retreat and go home.

The lesson ends with a different view of God and the world. It's a view where people are more concerned with making food than weapons. Here God is not seen as a warrior but as a teacher.

Conversation starters:

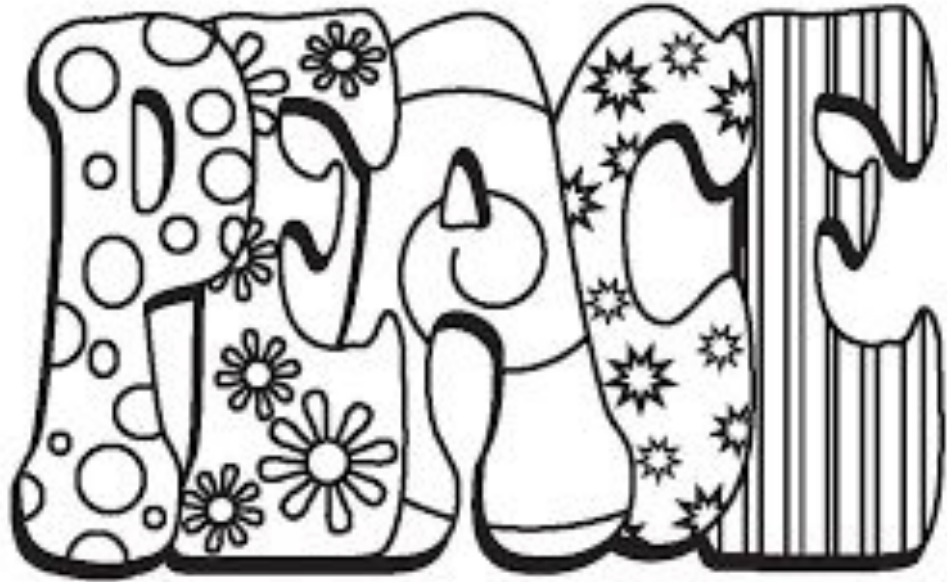
- Who sent an army to Jerusalem?
