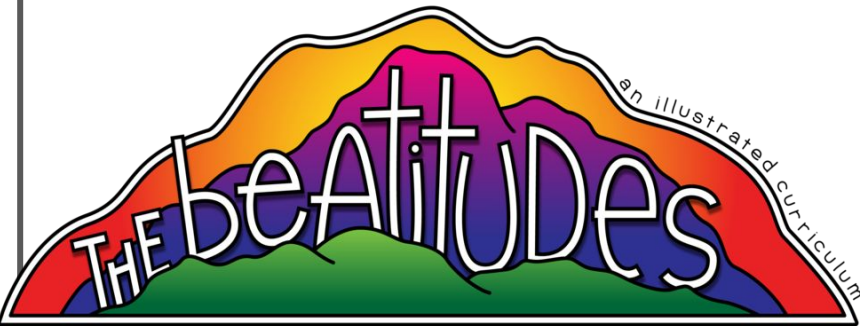

Beatitudes



The first part of this week's lesson is called the beatitudes which is a fancy word for blessed. Being blessed can be described as God's love or favor in our lives—even when we may not feel we deserve it. Jesus tells them that those who are blessed are: the poor in spirit, those who mourn, the meek, those who want righteousness, the merciful, the pure in heart, the peacemakers, and those who are persecuted for righteousness.

The next part refers to the people as the salt of the earth. He also says not to lose our flavor—maybe to stay on the path of faith? Finally, he calls us the light of the world and tells us to let our light shine for all to see.
